Sunday @ Seven featuring *Duo Seraphim*



On Sunday, **January 14, 2007**, concert-goers were treated to an astonishing, rarely-heard journey through the intimate chamber vocal music of the early baroque era presented by the vocal/instrumental ensemble *Duo Seraphim*, accompanied by period instruments.

Internationally-renowned early music soprano Katherine Hill (Netherlands) with soprano Julie Harris (Calgary) presented sacred and secular solos and duets from

the early baroque period. They were accompanied by Victor Coelho (Boston University) on the rarely-heard theorbo—a bass lute—and Stephanie Martin (York University, Toronto) on the harpsichord. The accompanists also delighted listeners with a harpsichord solo, as well as several solos for the theorbo. One of the more unusual vocal duets featured Harris and Coelho at the front of the hall, and Hill and Martin in the back, the latter echoing the

former for a highly unusual musical effect.

This concert was truly an event for lovers of early music in presenting the intense emotional range of this early baroque repertoire and the amazing vocal dexterity of the singers!

Update on Harpsichord Project

The harpsichord played at the *Duo Seraphim* concert on January 14 is a professional instrument on generous private loan to the Music Department until it completes fundraising for its own harpsichord. The Music Department is pleased to report a total of more than \$13,500 raised by December 2006, (i.e. less than \$2,500 from the project goal). Many thanks to all the generous donors! The Music Department is hopeful that final funding will be in place by summer 2007 so the project harpsichord can be delivered by fall term!
